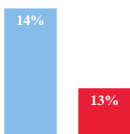

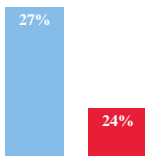

Percentage of SNAP Recipients Under Age 3



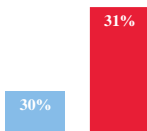

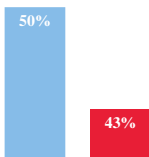
Percentage of TANF Families with at Least One Child Under Age 3

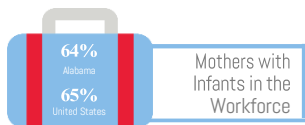


Percentage of Births Covered by Medicaid



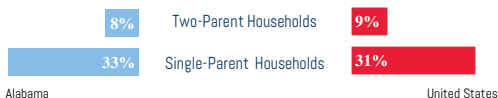

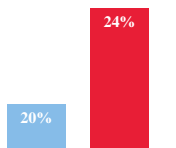
Percentage of SNAP Recipients Under Age 3

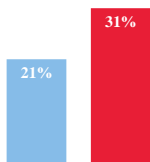

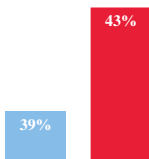
Percentage of TANF Families with at Least One Child Under Age 3

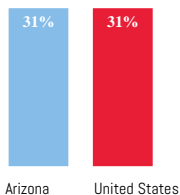
Percentage of SNAP Recipients Under Age 3



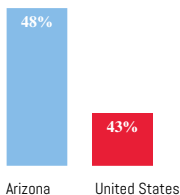

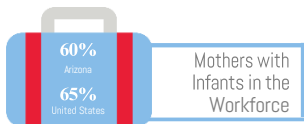
Percentage of TANF Families with at Least One Child Under Age 3

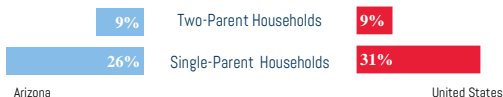

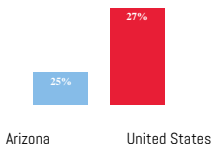

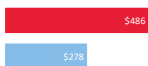
Children Under Age 3 Receiving Federal Childcare Support

Percentage of SNAP Recipients Under Age 3



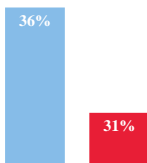

Percentage of SNAP Recipients Under Age 3



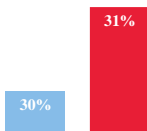

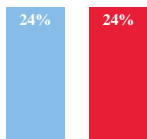
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Percentage of SNAP Recipients Under Age 3



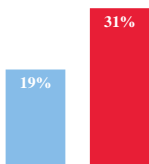

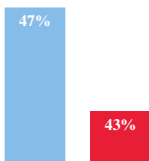
Percentage of TANF Families with at Least One Child Under Age 3

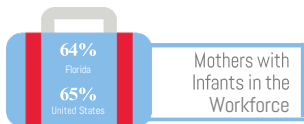


Percentage of Births Covered by Medicaid



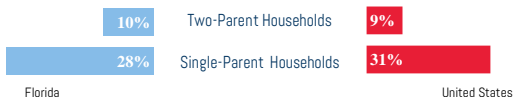

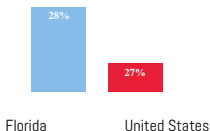

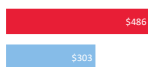
Children Under Age 3 Receiving Federal Childcare Support

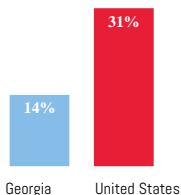
Percentage of SNAP Recipients Under Age 3



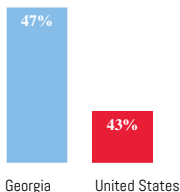

Percentage of SNAP Recipients Under Age 3



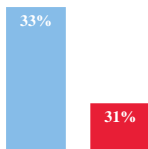

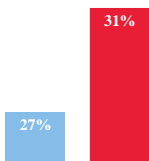

Percentage of SNAP Recipients Under Age 3



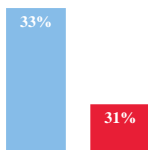

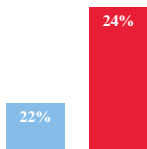
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Percentage of SNAP Recipients Under Age 3



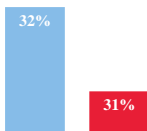

Percentage of SNAP Recipients Under Age 3



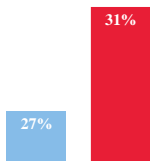

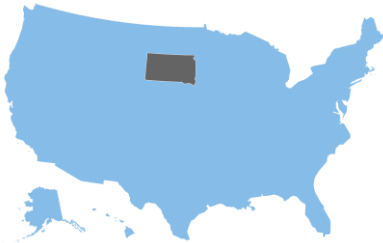

Percentage of SNAP Recipients Under Age 3



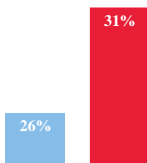

Percentage of SNAP Recipients Under Age 3



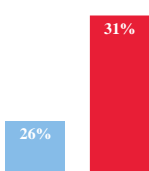

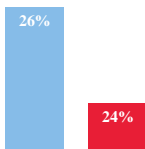

Percentage of SNAP Recipients Under Age 3



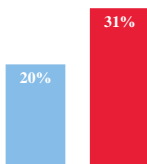

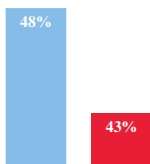
Percentage of TANF Families with at Least One Child Under Age 3

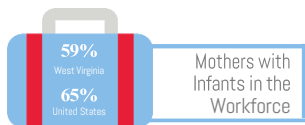


Percentage of Births Covered by Medicaid



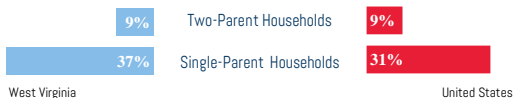

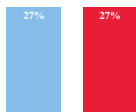

Children Under Age 3 Receiving Federal Childcare Support



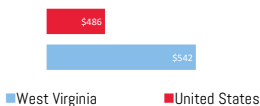

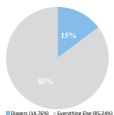

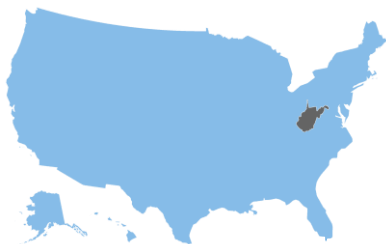


Diaper Costs Compared to Benefit

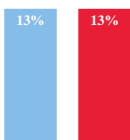

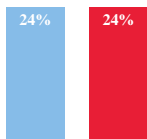

Percentage of SNAP Recipients Under Age 3



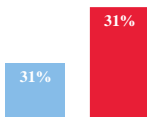

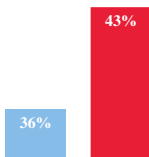
Percentage of TANF Families with at Least One Child Under Age 3

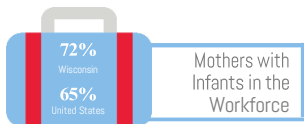


Percentage of Births Covered by Medicaid



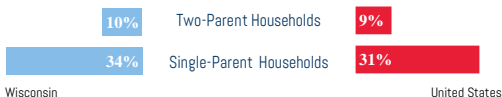

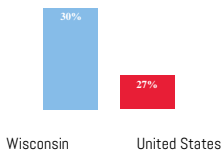

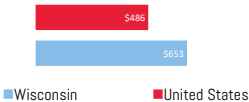
Children Under Age 3 Receiving Federal Childcare Support



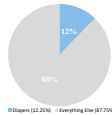

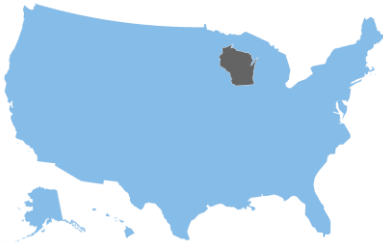

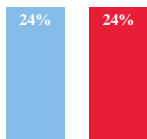
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Percentage of SNAP Recipients Under Age 3



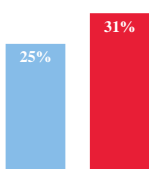

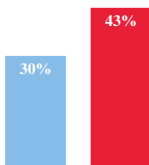
Percentage of TANF Families with at Least One Child Under Age 3

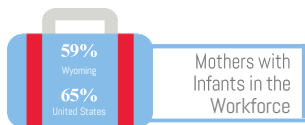


Percentage of Births Covered by Medicaid



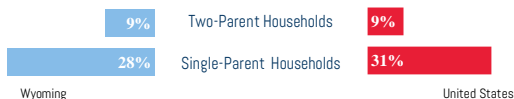

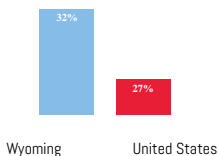

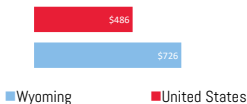
Children Under Age 3 Receiving Federal Childcare Support



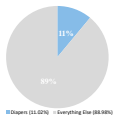

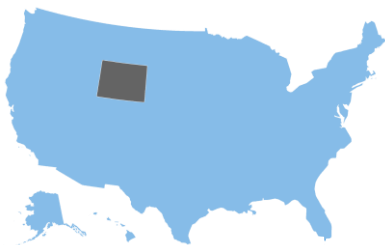


Diaper Costs Compared to Benefit
